
Disciplinary Chart



Level 1 = Lunch Detention

*No Parent Contact Required

Level 2 = SAM + 3 Lunch Detentions

*Parent Contact Required

Level 3 = Student Referral, 1 day of ISS + 5 days of Lunch Detention

*Parent Contacted by Teacher or Team Leader

Note: Once a student acquires a third violation at any level, he/she will automatically move to the next level of consequences. Alternative consequence may be given in place of detention.

Level 1 = Student Referral, 1 day of ISS + 5 days of Lunch Detention

*Parent Contacted by Team Leader or Principal

Level 2 = Student Referral, 3 days of ISS + 5 days of Lunch Detention

*Parent Contacted by Team Leader or Principal

Level 3 = Student Referral, 5 days of ISS + 5 days of Lunch Detention

*Parent Contacted by Team Leader or Principal

Note: Once a student acquires a third violation at any level, he/she will automatically move to the next level of consequences. Alternative consequence may be given in place of detention.

Level 1 = Student Referral, 5 days of ISS + 5 days of Lunch Detention

*Parent Contacted by Principal or Asst. Principal

Level 2 = Student Referral, 3 days of OSS + 5 days of Lunch Detention

*Parent Contacted by Principal or Asst. Principal

Level 3 = Student Referral, 10 days of OSS + 5 days of Lunch Detention

*Parent Contacted by Principal or Asst. Principal

DEFINED LEVELS OF DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR

MINOR (after initial warning)

- Disrespectful toward other students
- Disrupting class (calling out, excessive talking or socializing, interrupting others)
- Dress Code violation
- Electronic violation
- General classroom misconduct
- Head down (sleeping in class)
- Horseplay
- Inappropriate language
- Lying, cheating
- Non completion of assignments
- Nonparticipation
- Not following instructions
- Not following procedures
- Not prepared for class
- Off task
- Out of seat
- Poor attitude
- PDA
- Running in hallways
- Skipping class
- Tardiness
- Talking out of turn
- Throwing objects (food included)
- * A third occurrence of any minor violations will automatically result in a major consequence.

MAJOR

- Academic dishonesty
- Bullying (repeated threats, abuse, or intimidation)
- Computer/Technology vandalism
- Cyber Bullying (via any electronic device or online social network)
- Disrespectful towards teacher or staff member
- Destruction of school and/or personal property
- Disobedient/Insubordinate (student refuses to comply with teacher or staff member)
- Disorderly/ Inappropriate behavior
- Disrupting class (repeated behavior, student escorted from classroom)
- Fighting
- Forgery of a document or signature
- Gambling
- Gang related behavior or activity
- Leaving class without permission
- Pushing/ Shoving/Tripping
- Profane Language, which includes any racial, religious, or gender slurs or gestures (directed at student, teacher, or staff member)
- Theft
- Tobacco/Smoking/ Electronic cigarette
- * A third occurrence of any major violations will automatically result in an extreme consequence.

EXTREME

- Assault or threat towards teacher or staff member
- Battery/Fighting
- Bomb threat
- Bullying (repeated threats, abuse, or intimidation)
- Cyber Bullying (via any electronic device or online social network)
- Possession of Alcohol/ Drugs (or under the influence)
- Sexual Battery/Harassment
- Weapons, possession or use on school property (gun, knife, lighter, explosive device, or any object that may be used as a weapon)

^{*} A third occurrence of any extreme violations may result in student expulsion. Mr. Cooley will make that decision if necessary.
